Webinar Information for Board Meeting Attendees

There are 3 options for members of the public to attend TPFA's Board Meeting webinar:


- 1) via the Zoom application (PC or Mobile)
- 2) via web browser
- 3) via toll-free telephone number (dial-in)

Attend via Zoom Application

To attend the webinar via Zoom application, you must have the application installed on your PC or mobile device. Once it is installed, attend the video conference by clicking on the link provided on TPFA's website (<http://www.tpfa.texas.gov>). Follow the prompts to attend the Board Meeting.

Attend via Web Browser

To attend the webinar through a web browser, go to the TPFA website (<http://www.tpfa.texas.gov>) and click the link for the webinar. When your web browser opens, click the "join from your browser" link:



Follow the prompts to attend the Board Meeting.

Attend via Dial-In

To attend the webinar by calling a toll-free telephone number, go to the TPFA website (<http://www.tpfa.texas.gov>) to obtain the telephone numbers available, and the meeting ID of the webinar. Dial one of the numbers, then follow the prompts to attend the Board Meeting.

- 2) All chat functionality will be disabled.
- 3) The Q&A function will not be enabled.
- 4) When you attend the webinar, your audio will be muted (you will not be able to address the webinar) and video, if available, will be disabled (your video will not be seen by panelists or attendees). You will be able to hear and see the panelists (TPFA Board Members and TPFA staff). Dial-in attendees cannot see any video.
- 5) To request to speak, use the Raise Hand function. Refer to [Joining and participating in a webinar \(attendee\)](#) for details.
- 6) Attendees must be recognized by the Board Chair before being allowed to speak.
- 7) Dial-in attendees can use *6 to mute and unmute (if recognized to speak), and *9 to use the Raise Hand function.
